GIVE MORE ♦ GIVE YOURSELF

▶ Give the **RIGHT** gift for the **RIGHT** reason

“This is how God showed his love among us: He sent his one and only Son into the world [so] that we might live through him.” 1 John 4:9

“God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.” Romans 5:8

▶ Give in order to show them you **CARE**

“God loved the people of this world so much that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who has faith in him will have eternal life.” John 3:16

The Gift is an expression of the Giver’s heart

The Gift inspires the future, doesn’t dwell on the past

The Gift is an invitation to a deeper relationship

▶ Give where it’s **NEEDED** most

How did you know? It’s just what I wanted?

▶ Giving Questions

Am I giving this out of a sense of obligation, guilt, or expectation?

Will I go into debt? Will it cause stress and bitterness later?

Do I expect something in return?

Does my Giving reflect my desire to be like Christ?

John 1:35-42 (NIV)

³⁵The next day John was there again with two of his disciples.

³⁶When he saw Jesus passing by, he said, "Look, the Lamb of God!"

³⁷When the two disciples heard him say this, they followed Jesus. ³⁸Turning around, Jesus saw them following and asked, "What do you want?"

They said, "Rabbi" (which means Teacher), "where are you staying?"

³⁹"Come," he replied, "and you will see."

So they went and saw where he was staying, and spent that day with him. It was about the tenth hour.

- We give gifts to:
 - Mark and celebrate special occasions
 - Strengthen ties in a relationship
 - Honor or acknowledge the importance of the recipient
 - Exhibit sacrificial love
- It fits you
 - Not a "one-size-fits-all" [not re-gifting]
 - Gifts that match your temperament
 - A gift that fits means that the person who gave you the gift knows you, took the time to think about you
 - "It's the thought that counts."
- It meets a need
 - Not every gift needs to meet a need (some gifts are nice *because* they are luxurious)
 - But a gift is especially memorable if it's "just what I needed". Opens a door of discovery
- It involves some sacrifice on the giver's part:
 - Says the recipient is worth sacrificing for
 - The watch and the hairpin
 - "...and all I got was this lousy T-shirt"
